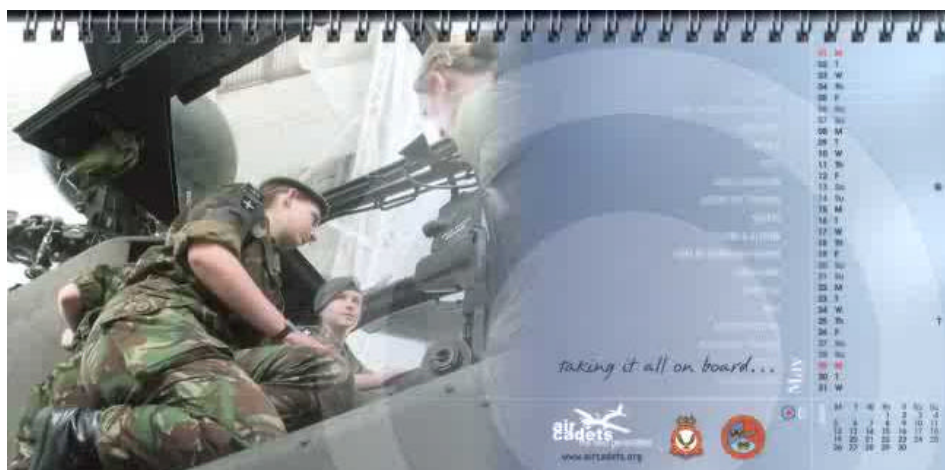
It's official, the 2006 national Air Cadet Organisation calendar features no less than three photographs submitted by 134 (Bedford) Squadron.
