Early on Saturday morning four cadets and the Commanding Officer from 115 (Peterborough) Squadron left for a weekend of kayaking at Cardington Artificial White Water Course at Bedford.

The cadets arrived early on Saturday morning and started their day by helping construct the course for the rest of the other squadrons who would attend on the following day. After a couple of hour's hard work, it was time to test out the course, and to check it was safe.

On the Sunday, almost 100 cadets from the Bedfordshire and Cambridgeshire area attended the white water taster day; where they learnt how to control a kayak on moving water and what to do to if they have capsized.
