



We Remembered Them

In the mid morning sun of a breezy Remembrance Sunday 34 cadets and 4 staff from 134 (Bedford) Squadron paraded alongside uniformed colleagues from the Territorial Army, Cadet Forces and other youth organisations to pay their respects to the fallen.

Forming the largest single uniformed contingent on parade the cadets' turnout was excellent and there were many complimentary comments from members of the public as they passed by.
