Recently local Air Cadets from 115 (Peterborough) Squadron were visited by Squadron Leader Al Pinner BSc MBE RAF, Officer Commanding of the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight.

Squadron Leader Pinner spoke to the cadets about the history of the Battle of Britain flight, its importance to modern day commemoration, and how they too could get involved.

Some months before, some of the cadets had visited the Battle of Britain's base at Royal Air Force Coningsby, and Squadron Leader Pinner wanted to meet more of the Peterborough cadets to show them the significance that the Memorial Flight still holds today, and that the Flight commemorates all those who have lost their lives in any battle, not just those in the Battle of Britain.

One of the Air Cadets, Cadet Corporal Elliott Dalton, age 17, commented on the Squadron Leaders presentation. "It was really interesting hearing about the history of the Memorial Flight, and hearing it from someone who is actually involved in delivering it today. It was really enjoyable, and I learnt a lot from it"

Air Cadets have the opportunity to take part in a vast amount of activities, such as flying, gliding, team sports, target shooting, camps, social events, adventure training and much more.
